#### Brook-Hart, Guy

Guy Brook-Hart has taught English for over 30 years. He started teaching in Egypt and has since worked in Kuwait, France, Britain and Spain where he works for the British Council. He was a co-author of *World Class*, a joint British Council/Open University Business English course, the British Council Online English Course and the British Council IELTS CD-ROM. With Cambridge University Press he has published *Instant IELTS* (CUP 2004), *Business Benchmark Upper-Intermediate* (CUP 2006), *Business Benchmark Advanced* (CUP 2007), *Complete First Certificate* (CUP 2008) and, with Simon Haines, *Complete CAE* (CUP 2009)

## **Brigitte Brunner**

Mag. Brigitte Brunner started her teaching career as a teacher of English and German at the Grammar School in Imst/Tirol in 1979 and has been a freelance teacher of English in Further Education Institutions for twenty years, specializing in Business English and preparing students for Cambridge ESOL exams. Brigitte has been a Cambridge ESOL Speaking Examiner since 1998 and Speaking Examiner Team Leader for the Cambridge ESOL Examinations for West Austria since 2002.

## **Content**

### **Workshop 1 – Common mistakes at CAE level (60 min)**

**Speaker: Guy Brook-Hart**

This workshop looks at common mistakes made by students at CAE level, where they are similar and where they are different from mistakes made at lower levels, what the mistakes show about their learning and their learning problems and suggests practical classroom activities for dealing with them.

### **Workshop 2 - Teaching writing skills to students moving from FCE to CAE (90 min) Speaker: Guy Brook-Hart**

In this abstract we look at the writing skills which are required at CAE level, the specific writing tasks students should be able to do and how they are different from FCE. We cover complexity of language, accuracy, register, coherence and structure all within the context of successful task completion and achieving the right impression on the reader. Apart from looking at exam and level requirements, this workshop will give practical examples of how to approach teaching writing skills at an advanced level in class.

### **Workshop 3 - Introduction to the First Certificate in English (FCE) and Certificate in Advanced English (CAE) (60 min) Speaker: Brigitte Brunner**

Cambridge English examinations are designed to reflect an approach to language learning which motivates students to use their English in practical ways, developing “real-world” skills and building confidence through engagement with a range of topics and situations. The *First Certificate in English* (FCE) is set at level B2 of the Common European Framework of Reference (CEFR) and the *Certificate in Advanced English* (CAE) at level C1. Both FCE and CAE elicit performance in Reading, Writing, Listening and Speaking, as well as Use of English. The seminar will introduce participants to the exams and present formats and task types.
